



Enhanced Language Training (ELT) for Agrologists

The new Enhanced Language Training (ELT) Program at Skills for Change is designed to enable **Internationally-educated Agrologists** to reach a level of English proficiency that will allow you to find and keep work appropriate for your qualifications and experience.

Program components include:

ASSESSMENT OF YOUR ENGLISH LEVEL

- An accurate assessment of your English proficiency: are you functioning at Canadian Language Benchmarks 6 or 7?

250 HOURS OF LANGUAGE AND JOB SEARCH TRAINING

- Improve your listening, speaking and reading skills
- Increase your technical vocabulary
- Work on English grammar and pronunciation
- Practise professional presentation and writing skills
- Learn and apply job search techniques and strategies that are effective for your sector

JOB SEARCH/DEVELOPMENT SUPPORT

- You will work with a job developer to find a Work Experience Placement and/or paid employment in your area of expertise
- Follow-Up Networking (FUN) sessions
- The opportunity to work with a Mentor in your profession

You can apply for this program if:

- you are an Internationally-educated Agrologist
- your level of English proficiency stops you from finding the job you want or from articling in your field
- you are a Refugee Claimant, Convention Refugee or Permanent Resident
- you are eligible to work in Canada
- you need Canadian work experience

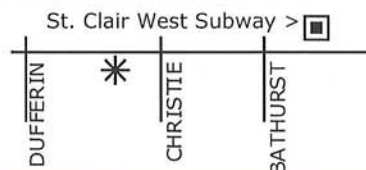
